Scribus is a user friendly but powerful Desktop Publishing application already in use for everything from club newsletters to small newspaper production to animated interactive PDF presentations, as well as being used as output to professional quality image-setting equipment.

SQL Ledger is a double-entry accounting program where data stored in a SQL server can be linked through any GUI browser to maintain sales, revenue, expense, inventory, tax accounts and other records by means of templates.

NOTES -

PROXIES - Members unable to attend the AGM, but who wish to arrange for another member to vote on their behalf are reminded of the following requirements as laid down in the Constitution -

Rule 35. Voting - sub-rule

(2) All votes shall be given personally or by proxy but no member may hold more than 5 proxies.

Rule 36. Appointment of proxies

- (1) Each member shall be entitled to appoint another member as proxy by notice given to the Secretary no later than 24 hours before the time of the meeting in respect of which the proxy is appointed.
- (2) The notice appointing the proxy shall be in the form set out in Appendix 1 to these Rules.
- 2. NOTE that the Proxy form must be signed personally by the member giving the proxy and the original signed form must be lodged with the Secretary no later than 7pm on Sunday 26 September. It will assist the Secretary to confirm the validity of the proxy if the member giving the proxy also marks his/her membership number on the form.

PCUG Broadband via TransACT Charges Reduced Yet Again

The PCUG Committee, in association with that the ISSC, has reviewed the charges for the PCUG Internet Services as part of its preparation of its budget for the coming financial year. The Committee has decided that we can now afford to reduce the charges we make for Broadband via TransACT as follows -

Pay in advance for twelve months or 7,200Mb - \$240 (down from \$280)

Pay in advance for six months or 3,600Mb - \$130 (down from \$145)

Pay in advance for three months or 1,800Mb - \$70 (down from \$75)

The new charges will take effect from 1 September 2004.



PCUG now offers members Broadband Access to the internet using the ADSL system (P-DSL). Of course this is in addition to the services we already provide to members in our Internet Service - dial-up and broadband through TransACT.

The P-DSL service is available anywhere in the ACT and NSW (and now also available anywhere in Australia), where the telephone lines are suitable for ADSL, that includes everywhere in the ACT and NSW that TransACT does not service.

Not the cheapest, but the best value for money! Do not be tricked by apparently cheaper offers that finish up costing you an arm and a leg in excess usage charges! Our charges are low and our download quotas the highest.

COPERNIC ENTERS SEARCH RACE

Many of you will remember the Copernic web search program from years past.

Well now they've entered the market for finding documents and emails on your computer with Copernic Desktop Search www.copernic.com

The Windows XP indexing tool is a dreadful resource hog and best avoided. The news that Longhorn (the next major Windows release) will not have the new file system probably also means that the innovative document searching and organization system is also on hold. This means an open field for tools to search your hard drive.

If you've only ever used the Windows XP search then you're in for a treat. Once the index on one of the third party products is complete, you can find documents based on a few words in the blink of an eye and you can also search emails in Outlook or Outlook Express with similar speed.

Companies like X1 and Dtsearch have been joined by Copernic. Other companies have time-limited trial versions but Copernic have a different approach. As they have with other products, Copernic have released a free version of Copernic Desktop Search which will be joined later by paid versions with extra features. It's available at www.copernic.com

President's Report

This is my last report before the election of a new committee. I urge anyone interested in the future of the PCUG to consider standing for election. The PCUG relies on the preparedness of volunteers to stand and contribute to the continued running of the organisation. May I also encourage those who haven't served in other capacities, such as weekday or weekend staffers, to consider doing so. We are always looking for more volunteers to continue the work and not all roles require any special computer knowledge. Please remember that our motto is "Users Helping Users".

Neither I nor most of the existing committee will be standing again (in my own case my paid work looks like being intensely busy over the next twelve months and I prefer to spare what little time I have to assisting looking after my four year old son). Nonetheless I am a member of the new committee as immediate past president (although if work is too onerous I might have to reconsider serving even in that capacity).

We often do not thank our hidden army of volunteers enough (and sometimes this is pointed out by others as a reminder to us) so I intend to express those thanks here to the best of my ability. So I wish to thank:

The weekday and weekend staffers who come day after day after day to the Centre, sometimes when very few attend and the opening of the Centre might seem pointless - I assure them it isn't. Our members rely on the knowledge that the Centre is open and before we opened fully some were put off coming in by not remembering when we were open and when not. I am truly grateful.

The volunteers who attend our table at the Computer Fairs. Often, especially when there are too few volunteers, the person attending stayed the full hours that the Fair was open, hoping to build the PCUG to greater levels. I marvel at their continued enthusiasm and helpfulness.

The 'Stuffers' who for many years stuffed and labelled the hard copy of the magazine (and then the newsletter) and then continued to be on call for other duties when asked.

The Co-ordinators of Special Interest Groups who continue, some over very many years, to look after these groups and ensure their continuity and viability.

Our 'Hit' team who visit homes and provide a very special personalised service, much appreciated by those struggling with the vagaries of misbehaving equipment.

Our trainers, who have also provided paid and unpaid services (and even the paid trainers are not paid at realistic rates) and who have helped to ensure good use of the Centre.

A special thank you to those who serve in more than one capacity. Even with our motto "Users Helping Users" we are short of volunteers and these people put in a real special effort. It is deeply appreciated.

A thank you also to our TIP admins. This year the Committee's relationship with some individuals in this group has been stormy but I truly thank those individuals who have continued their functions and commitment year after year and day after day. I thank especially those who have helped us introduce new services and who have appreciated the need for change in order for the organisation to survive. We know and acknowledge that without their efforts the Group would not be able to continue.

Having thanked groups without naming individuals, I now wish to thank individuals and I hope those whom I have not mentioned will forgive me.

Gordon Urquart, who attends several special interest groups, co-ordinates one of them (two?), attends at computer fairs, assists at monthly meetings, advises and visits individual members and so much more. Gordon, a very real thank you.

Lance Green, who edited the newsletter both last year and this and, having indicated his wish (decision) to give this duty up has continued to edit the newsletter up until this edition. He has suffered late submissions (including mine) and has provided outstanding dedication and commitment.

Madeline Mould, who although a paid employee as our Executive Secretary, has contributed her heart and soul to the well-being of the organisation and has also provided many hours of additional volunteer labour.

As most of the Committee are not standing for re-election I can thank individuals without it being seen as electioneering. I have served on the committee since 1999 and this has been the best committee that I have experienced. I have relied heavily on them and some have done some of my duties for me, making my job very much easier. A number of committee members have many years of senior management experience and, best of all, have not been interested in self-aggrandisement. Indeed most were heavily persuaded by others to join the committee against their will, but joined with a true commitment to serving the organisation with a sincere lack of self-interest. Mind you, they have not suffered fools gladly, although their tact in not expressing their opinions has been outstanding.

Noel Matthews, although officially Treasurer and Chair of the ISSC, has done much, much more. An example, in the past we relied on the TIP admins to negotiate renewal of our internet content from suppliers such as Comindico. This year, when the Admin support was not available to do this, he took on the role, learnt the complexities and negotiated a reduction in the monthly fee from around \$2,400 to around \$900 - a significant saving that has helped the PCUG to survive financially. He has answered voluminous correspondence on internet matters, been responsible for instigating changes which have provided members with more internet options and has guided us through the financial minefield with commonsense, foresight and a hell of a lot of very hard work.

Allan Hepworth - Centre Manager - instructor in networks, Access, use of the new media equipment and maintainer of our training room equipment and much more than this again. Sometimes, whilst working full-time, doing in excess of another 30 or 40 hours per week and also full of good ideas aimed at improving the future of the organisation. So significant has his contribution been that we nominated him for Volunteer of the Year over and above many who have served us for decades (yes, decades) because of the impact of his work.

Tom Hayes, our Secretary, is another who has provided good commonsense and good management and has been a major support. Absolutely reliable and responsible and he has helped ensure that we are heading in the right direction.

Graeme Evans. Graeme is one who sought out and encouraged others to join the Committee and for this alone is to be highly commended in providing us with a committee prepared to work hard. But he has done much more, he has worked interminably to encourage the involvement of government and semi-government bodies in PCUG's future. Looking at ways to change our role in the community, he has had a clear sense on the future direction of the PCUG and has invited all sorts of authorities to inspect our premises and to consider what they could do for us and for the wider community.

John Hodge is another enthusiast who has spent many hours organising monthly meetings and, in our view, improving the quality of these out of hand. In addition, he has worked with Ken Ford and Allan Hepworth on the media facilities and helped many individuals. Again, a person who has spent excessive hours contributing to the well-being of the PCUG (I can't help wondering when he and Allan found time to sleep).

Ken Ford has also contributed in many ways, to monthly meetings, additional help to Lance Green, full of good ideas and, once again, someone fully committed to the future of the PCUG and who has really worked very, very hard to look after the PCUG's future

Paul Free, another person full of good ideas and responsible for our survey which resulted in over 400 replies, which exceeded previous survey responses by about 1000 per cent (and resulted in, I seem to recall, 200 plus hours of analysis). A very commendable effort (and, of course, I thank our members for responding in such numbers and with such concern for the future of the organisation)

Many thanks also to Annette Fischer. Annette was only a recent appointment to the committee and showed the clear potential to contribute as much as the other members of the committee and I am only sorry that we haven't had the opportunity to use her skills as much as the others. I am sure that other organisations will poach her services.

I must also thank the group who call themselves "The Serfs" who have undertaken the job of updating and upgrading the PCUG web site. Over the last ten years the PCUG web site has become both out of date and tired. To bring it up to date is a very big task, but the Serfs have taken that task on with enthusiasm, and by the time you read this the upgraded web site will be operational. A very big thanks to those hard working volunteers.

Finally, I can't say much about Keith Sayers as he is standing for the new committee, but his sincerity and his commitment to communicating with the membership are to be much admired. Best wishes.

I wish to conclude by thanking once again all those I haven't named and I also wish the incoming committee all the best.

Report on Committee Meeting September 2004

The Committee reviewed the plans for the AGM to be held later in September. It agreed that a list of all nominations received will be circulated by email to all members after nominations close but before the AGM. It agreed to suggest a person for appointment as Returning Officer at the meeting. If there are more nominations than the positions available (four Officers and ten Committee Members) the voting will be on paper ballots. The Returning Officer will be responsible for counting the ballots and declaring the result of the elections.

The Committee agreed on the processes for receiving nominations and for receiving and approving proxies lodged according to the requirements of the PCUG Constitution. Either at the end of the meeting or during the counting of votes, Owen Cook will speak on Open Source software.

Brief plans for the October Monthly Meeting were discussed, but the responsibility for that and future meetings will lie with the Committee elected at the AGM.

Progress with the two surveys being conducted on behalf of PCUG by students from the University of Canberra was discussed.

The ISSC reported that the upgrade of the PCUG web site was going well, and that the new web site should be available to members before the AGM. Subscriptions to the P-DSL internet service were growing satisfactorily with ten subscribers now in operation.

The Treasurer reported that both income and expenditure were tracking close to budget. The financial situation of PCUG was somewhat precarious, but at this stage no urgent action was needed. He also reported that the auditors had issued the Audited Financial Statements for the 2003-2004 year. The result of operations in the last financial year was a surplus of \$16,500, compared with the deficit the previous year of \$15,700, meant that the finances of PCUG had turned around by \$32,200 in the past year.

The Committee received a report on inspection by some of its members of space offered in an ACT Government building at Spence. The space was suitable, and the annual cost would represent a saving of \$33,000 in the cost of the present Centre at Northpoint Plaza. There is adequate free parking on site. The only disadvantage is the location at the far North of the Canberra urban area.

The Committee decided that it would take no action on the location of the PCUG Centre, leaving that decision to the incoming Committee.

PCUG Needs Volunteers

PCUG relies on the work of a team of volunteers to continue providing its many programs for members. We have a small but dedicated team of volunteers, but many have been working hard for PCUG for years. We need more people urgently.

Our internet service would not operate without the small group of dedicated and technically expert volunteers who manage our servers.

PCUG could not operate without the small group of dedicated members who volunteer their time to staff the PCUG Centre seven days a week (except on long weekends). The few volunteers who prepare the Computer Skills Centre for use by our trainers and training organisations which hire it do a critically important job.

Other volunteers run our stalls at the regular computer fairs in Canberra, organise our monthly meetings, print, envelope and mail our membership renewals, and do the many other small but important tasks that keep the club operations going.

We all owe them a big debt of gratitude.

But many of them are getting tired, so if you can give us up to four hours once or twice a month you will make a real contribution to the health of the Club. We will teach you the job and you don't necessarily have to be a computer expert. Please contact the President at email cpcug.president@pcug.org.au>.

Our advice for Office 2003 SP1 still stands - wait for a few weeks to see how it shakes out. There's already reports of SP2 problems. The usual crop of installation hassles that even the massive 70 plus MB download won't fix. Despite what Microsoft is saying it seems some people still need their Office 2003 install CD handy even when using the full size update.

In stark contrast to the secretive Office updates, the Windows SP2 update is well documented with problems being acknowledged fairly promptly and there's a long list of Windows programs that will have trouble with the new Service Pack.

What to do? That's a hard one for anyone who is cautious about Microsoft products and their updates. There's no doubt that both updates are worth applying, especially the Windows XP update. The real question is when?

We're inclined to update Windows XP first and make sure the operating system is stable before later applying the Office 2003 update.

Problems Logging into the Internet Service?

If you ever find yourself failing to log in to TIP, STOP and don't waste any more money trying to dial in again. Paying more money fixes the first problem, re-typing your Username and Password into the Log In dialogue fixes the second problem 99% of the time. Jim's Market Tips

- 1. Don't be in too much of a hurry to buy. Satisfy yourself that its what you want, then examine the goods thoroughly B4 handing over your money. This is mentioned because people tend quite often to feel under pressure to buy in case somebody else grabs it B4 they do. Take your time.
- 2. Once having made up your mind and handed over your money, don't simply rush off. Wait for the receipt. Make sure the receipt has the details of the dealer and phone number and any other details like warranty info etc. In a busy situation it is quite possible that these important details are left out as the dealer wants to get to his next sale. Remember you have every right to get a receipt no matter how small the purchase. Any problems come and see us.
- 3. If you did not get a receipt or dealer's details ring us on 0405 055 288 with his location in the hall and we will dig up his details for you.
- 4. Last but not least, please do not wait till the next fair to fix up any problems you have with the goods. Install the goods after purchasing and ring the dealer immediatley if a problem occurs. We have had people wait 2 months or more B4 doing something about faulty goods and then wanted a refund. Most dealers won't refund (if they have a refund policy) after a certain period of time. So the quicker the action the better the resolution that is obtained.
