

#### **Report from Annual General Meeting**

The Annual Meeting of the PC Users Group (ACT) Inc. was held in the Haydon-Allen Lecture Theatre, (The Tank) at the Australian National University, Acton, on Monday 29 September 2003 beginning at 7:30pm. The AGM was attended by approximately 25 members.

#### **President's Report**

The President, David Lewis, reported that the Committee for the year just ended had begun its work under some difficulty due to the number of vacancies left unfilled after the previous AGM. It had taken some time to find appropriate people to fill the essential vacancies, such as Secretary and Treasurer, but the Group was fortunate in the people who had agreed to accept those appointments.

The Committee was faced with a serious challenge after the large financial losses of the previous years, and with only 9 months left by the time it had a minimum number of people, the task of turning the financial situation around was daunting. The Committee took a number of actions to reduce expenditures. The one which caused him the most concern was the decision to stop printing and circulating Sixteen Bits by post. Whilst the Newsletter circulated by email has been successful, he hoped that soon an editor would be found so that Sixteen Bits could resume publication, although in future it would be circulated electronically.

He thanked Ann Greiner on behalf of the Group for her sterling work as Editor of Sixteen Bits. Her resignation from the position was regretted, but she had served for a very long time in a demanding position.

He thanked Madeline Mould for the very strong support she had given the Committee throughout the past year.

The President reported that the Committee had established a new Internet Services Sub-Committee (ISSC) early in the year, with the task of revitalising the Internet Project. The ISSC had takend a number of initiatives, giving Users larger mailbox and web site quotas, up to five email aliases and additional downloads. It had also replaced the outdated Acceptable Use Policy with an updated Conditions of Service.

He mentioned in particular the work Michael Lightfoot had done which resulted in a large saving in upstream provider costs.

The PCUG Centre had become rather tired in recent years, and the newly appointed Centre Manager, Allan Hepworth, had started a program to progressively replace and update the facilities to make the Centre a more attractive place for members. Future plans included Games Nights and other activities.

The President said that the incoming Committee faced some serious challenges. Probably the most difficult was the declining membership of the Group. More volunteers were badly needed and further promotion of the internet service and the training room.

Finally he thanked on behalf of all members all the volunteers who staff the Centre, administer the internet service, coordinate SIGs and attend the computer markets. The stuffers who had worked so hard for us over the years deserved a special thanks.

#### **Financial Report**

The Treasurer, Noel Matthews, reported that despite the best efforts of the Committee, PCUG finished the year with a deficit of \$15,400. However that was better than the previous year's of \$37,000. The Group had about \$120,000 in the bank, but members net assets were \$38,000. He pointed out that the Group has around \$250,000 worth of equipment but its assets are not sufficient to replace that equipment when it wears out.

He concluded by telling members that the budget for the current year forecast a surplus of about \$11,600. The Group would not go broke in the coming year, but much still needed to be done.

#### **Election of Committee**

As there were insufficient nominations to fill all the vacancies there was no election and the following people were declared elected -

President - David Lewis Vice-President - Vacant Secretary - Vacant Treasurer - Noel Matthews

General Committee - Graeme Evans, Paul Free, Keith Sayers., Allan Hepworth

There are seven vacant Committee positions, which may be filled by the Committee.

#### Amendments to the Constitution.

Notice had been given of six Special Resolutions which would amend the PCUG Constitution. All six Special Resolutions were passed by the AGM. The six changes to the Constitution were, in summary -

- 1. Simplification of the Registration of New Members
- 2. Authority to Establish Various Classes of Membership
- 3. Authority to Levy Different Membership Fees for the Various Classes
- 4. Reducing the Period before the AGM that Nominations for Election to the Committee must be Lodged the AGM amended the proposed six weeks to six days
- 5. A consequential amendment of rule 18 to require a Membership Register to be maintained
- 6. Authority to send notices to Members by email or other electronic means as well as post.

After the AGM had ended Paul Free reported briefly on the strategic options which the Committee was considering for the future of the Group. A report on those options is later in this Newsletter.

#### ??PCUG: WHERE TO NOW??

This short note invites members to consider the future needs of the Association, to comment on some specific questions, and to let your committee know your views. It follows a presentation which I made to the recent AGM on a Strategic Plan for the next five years.

The 2002 AGM was disturbed when it was revealed that the Association had operated at a loss During the ½ financial year. The new Committee set to work to reverse this situation and this involved some hard decisions. In particular, Sixteen Bits which had cost \$K40 in the year was discontinued and replaced by a short Newsletter which was also made available on our web page. It is hoped that the magazine can be resurrected but in an electronic format but this will not happen until a new editor can be found.

In addition, the Committee set up a small sub-committee to conduct a Strategic Review. The sub committee has reported to the Committee . In brief , it recommended that the Committee should

- Redefine the objectives of PCUG,
- · Assess the value of the Training Room to the membership and discontinue the lease its cost cannot be justified,
- Update the constitution to allow for family membership and differential fees based on personal circumstances.

It also suggested that the Committee should seek members views on what they expect to gain from membership, and examine the age distribution of members to see if our activities meet their specific needs.

It is evident that the circumstances have changed greatly from when the Association was first formed. Computers have become much faster and flexible and younger members are already more computer literate than the older members were when they first joined. TIP, which was a ground breaking achievement when first established now faces stiff competition from several providers. Membership numbers have fallen somewhat.

Members views are invited on the following questions:-

- MAGAZINE This was costing about 60% of the membership fee. What fraction would you consider reasonable and would you be happy with an electronic only version?
- TRAINING ROOM This costs about \$K20 but returns only \$K5 due to lack of use. Do you agree that it should be discontinued?
- CENTRE This costs about \$K35 but it seems essential that we maintain a shop front and at least a small meeting room. Nevertherless it does not receive many members and may not be convenient for some. Should we retain a centre and if so how big should it be? Is there a better site for a centre?

#### **The Internet Project**

Earlier this year the PCUG Committee recognised that the previously effective management arrangements for TIP had failed to keep pace with developments. The Committee agreed to establish a new Sub-Committee which will report directly to the PCUG Committee, to be called the "Internet Services Sub-Committee" (ISSC). The Terms of Reference of the ISSC are, -

Subject to the overall direction of the PCUG Committee -

the ISSC shall make all decisions relating to the financial, policy and administrative management of TIP;

the ISSC shall oversight the implementation of policies approved by the Committee, including resolution of disputes between users and PCUG, application of PCUG rules and regulations;

the ISSC shall monitor the operations of TIP, plan for future needs and developments, maintenance and replacement of equipment and the provision of finances as necessary to ensure the long term viability of TIP; the ISSC shall report all significant decisions and any decision involving expenditure exceeding \$1,000 to the PCUG Committee, but all decisions involving expenditure over \$2,000 shall be subject to approval in advance by the PCUG Committee.

It is the intention of the Committee that the ISSC will work closely with the TIP admins and with the Committee to ensure that decision making is fast and effective, and that financial considerations are properly considered so that effective and efficient operation of TIP may continue over the long term.

Since it began work the ISSC has already made a number of improvements to the TIP system, in co-operation with our volunteer administrators:-

The size of email mailboxes has been increased from a normal quota of 2MB (maximum allowed 10MB) to 25MB (maximum allowed 55MB).

The size of the disk space available for Users private web sites has been increased from 10MB (maximum 11MB) to 50MB (maximum 55MB).

All TIP Users with either Full Service or Broadband Service may now have attached to their email service up to five email aliases.

The Acceptable Use Policy which had remained unchanged since 1997 has been replaced by an updated Conditions of Service.

Broadband Users download quotas have been increased to 500MB per month.

Volunteer administrators are working on upgrading the TIP accounting system so that more changes in the download limits and time on line options available to Users may be offered.

A number of enhancements to the internet services offered to members are being considered, but they cannot be progressed until the work on updating the TIP accounting system has been completed.

A small group of volunteers is working hard on updating and renewing the PCUG and TIP web sites, which have become outdated.

The ISSC investigated offering ADSL services to those members who are not currently served by the TransACT cable. However the options previously available would not allow PCUG to offer a viable ADSL service. PCUG is now able to announce that it is able to provide our members with a reliable ADSL service at reasonable prices, in assoication with TransACT. Service is now available in Fadden, Gowrie and Macarthur, and will be progressively extended to the rest of Tuggeranong followed by the rest of Canberra by the end of the year. Two options are available, TalkWeb 256 and TalkWeb 512, each of which offers broadband internet connection plus TransACT telephone service.

#### **PCUG Centre**

The current facilities at the PCUG Centre did little more than provide access to Email and some scanning capability for members during the past year. It was necessary to maintain these systems in order to improve our overall finances and to be able to set a budget for upgrades and replacements. I am happy to announce that this program has begun by firstly upgrading the fax/photocopying facilities and Execsec computer. The PCUG financial package has been updated and a new members database is to be released. The network has also been updated from a 10MB switch to a new 100Mb switch improving our LAN performance.

Members will see next month a new Multimedia center established at the Centre, with the purchase of a new P4 computer that will burn DVD's, CD's, allow tape and vinyl records to be transferred to new CD/DVD media and editing of video media. The month following will see a new Graphics centre being installed with the procurement of a new P4 computer and scanner that will allow members to finally take high resolution scans of images, scan 35mm negatives, OCR documents, produce high colour pictures with newly installed

software and be able to burn these off to CD and DVD.

In the next month a new dual Xeon processor server will be installed to support the centre. It will replace the current server which is very noisy with something more grunty but will also support the running of Network LAN Games. It is my intention to arrange specific times where all the younger members of our group will be able to have a good old shoot them up. Essentially, you can look forward to seeing something new nearly every month that you come down to the centre in the next year.

We are also happy to announce the starting of a new Networking SIG. This SIG will commence in November and will be held on the first Wednesday of each month. Allan Hepworth will chair this SIG and It is intended to be a practical, hands on, doing group. New challenges will be set each month for participants who like to be challenged or just learn the basics. If you want to know more please register your interest to my email allanh@pcug.org.au

We would also like to announce to members the fantastic training facility that we have. It is available for external hire at a very cheap rate compared to other sites. We ask all members to spread the word to all and sundry about this facility as it costs a fair amount of members money to maintain this facility. If the room does not perform over the next year we may be forced to close it. It only needs to have utilisation two days a month to cover costs so get out there and promote your PCUG.

Finally, the centre will be having some bring and buy mornings and hosting our own version of the computer markets for members only. Volunteer technical staff will be rostered to provide support on weekends to solve those problems that you can't solve through the week.

We look forward to all members at some stage over the next year coming in the Belconnen centre and to start familiarising themselves with all of the wonderous new technology that has been absent for the past year.

#### PCUG Now Able to Offer Broadband Service to Suburbs not covered by TransACT Cable

Members are advised that PCUG will provide internet service to new customers served by the TransACT ADSL system which will be extended over the next few months to serve all of Canberra.

Service is available so far only in Fadden, Gowrie and Macarthur but will soon extend to the rest of Tuggeranong followed by the rest of Canberra.

Charges are as follows -

TransACT Pricing Terms (All pricing includes GST)

Contract length 18 months

Installation \$150 installation charge which if requested TransACT can provide interest free finance across the length of the contract of 18 months.

Customer will need an ADSL modem, which TransACT will sell them if requested.

Talk to our staff at the Centre for details.

TransACT Monthly charges

- \$39.95 per month for TalkWeb 256 (Broadband 256KB/64KB and telephone service)
- \$54.95 per month for TalkWeb 512 (Broadband 512KB/64KB and telephone service)

PCUG TIP charges in addition - \$25.00 for each month or 500MB downloads.

#### **Changes in Membership Classes and Fees**

As reported earlier the AGM approved amendments to the Constitution of the PCUG, two of which which authorise the Committee to establish different classes of Membership (Rule 7) and also to prescribe different membership fees for the various classes of membership (Rule 11).

At its October meeting the Committee established the following classes of membership with the annual fees shown. Notes under each class of membership explain what each class of membership applies to. The previous membership classes of Associate Family Membership and International Membership have been abolished, as the distribution of the PCUG magazine or newsletter by email means we do not need to arrange for fees to be varied to pay postage costs.

Membership fees have not been increased for some years. In view of the financial situation of the Group the Committee agreed that a small increase (about 7%) in membership fees should be made this year. The fees for Concessional / Pensioner members have been increased more than the other fees in recognition that a higher proportion of our members are now paying the concessional rates than was previously the case. To offset the additional increase in membership fees for concessional and pensioner members, for the next twelve months those members will be given an additional reduction in the charges for all training courses undertaken. The charge for those members for all training courses will be \$35.00 per course (rather than \$44.00 charged to other members).

The following classes of membership and annual membership fees apply from 1 November 2003 -

General Membership \$ 65.00
