Members at the CnC were canvassed about running a Car Pooling Service. They generally agreed that the demand did not warrant a sophisticated on-line system. It would take a lot of effort to create and then to maintain it at a time when we are questioning basic services to our members. A proposal that requests be handled centrally was not favoured. It would take up valuable time trying to match requests for transport with offers and in the event of a lift having to be cancelled at the last minute communication could become difficult. It appears, therefore, that the best solution

would be for members to make arrangements amongst themselves in the same way as they do for CnC meetings. There is no reason why members can not use the CnC mailing list, if they wish, to ask for a lift or to offer lifts to the MMM.

RHEINBERGER CENTRE

Thanks to our Treasurer, Derek Jordan, the Rheinberger Centre will be the regular home for our Main Monthly Meetings, at least through to November. Derek has negotiated an all-inclusive price for the hire of the Conference Room from 7pm to 10pm every first Wednesday of the month. Built into the fee is the use of a lectern with microphone and lamp and a data projector. Although these items are not yet provided, the centre expects to have them installed soon. We are also allowed to self-cater which means our traditional coffee, tea and biscuits can continue at the end of the meetings.

The centre staff will set up the Conference Room to seat 100 people but there are plenty of chairs and enough room to seat 200 if we need them.

Now we can plan our MMM knowing that we have a safe reliable venue. Thanks Derek.




