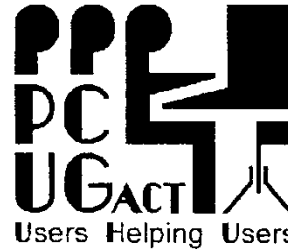

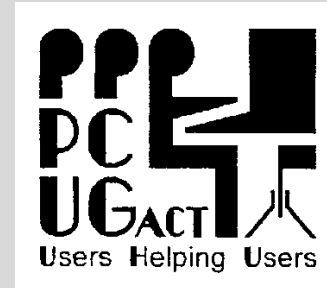

ABOUT US

PCUG is an incorporated, not-for-profit **volunteer organisation**. Our members share interests in the use of personal computers, other digital devices, and the Internet. PCUG's website www.pcug.org.au provides an overview of our current activities and services.

Our motto is '*Users Helping Users*'.

Members enjoy a variety of **Special Interest Groups** (SIGs) and training opportunities that are conducted as information sharing sessions, discussion groups (face-to-face or email), presentations, workshops, or tuition. The sessions are conducted at various well-equipped locations.

Members may tap into **technical support** via our website, email support, phone support, SIGs, or even a home visit (subject to the availability of volunteers).

Membership is available to individuals and households.

SPECIAL INTEREST GROUPS (SIGs)

Groups of members meet and socialize in locations of their own choice. These informal gatherings have a 'users helping users' approach to problem solving. Full details of current SIGs are available on the PCUG website. Popular groups include:

Beginners' SIG

Everyday computer issues are discussed and/or demonstrated. Some sessions are theme based, such as 'Backups', 'Emailing', 'Basic Windows', 'Internet Searching', e.g. with Google. No question is too simple!

Coffee & Chat (CnC)

This is a popular daytime SIG that has developed into a friendly and entertaining forum for discussions about technology developments and issues. Sessions are then followed up with open email discussions.

Investment SIG

This group has discussions, guest speakers and demonstrations on property investment, share trading, superannuation, portfolio management, technical analysis and related software packages.

Linux Learners' SIG

This SIG has demonstrations and discussions of procedures for operating a PC using totally free software, via the Linux operating system. It is suitable for beginner to intermediate users.

PRESENTATIONS

We invite members and guest speakers to existing SIGs or other events such as our 'Main Monthly Meetings' to talk on varied computer related topics such as:

- *Computer security,*
- *Digital photography,*
- *Software (open-source and commercial),*
- *Operating systems,*
- *Tablets and similar devices, as well as*
- *Genealogy software.*
