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Printing a Web Page

- 1. If necessary, start Internet Explorer.
- In the Address bar, type a Web address and press Enter.
- 3. The Web page appears.
 4. On the File menu, click Print.
- 5. The Print Dialog box appears.
- In the Page Range section, choose pages, and then click the OK button.
- 7. Your Web page is printed.

Saving a Complete Web Page

- 1. If necessary, start Internet Explorer.
- 2. In the Address bar, type a Web address and press Enter to display a Web page.
 3. On the File menu, click Save As.
 4. The Save Web Page dialog box appears.

- 5. If necessary, click the Save In drop-down arrow, and click Desktop.

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Saving a Complete Web Page

- (continued)
 6. In the File Name text box, select the current filename, and type Complete Web Page.
- Page.
 7. The document you are saving will be named Complete Web Page.
 8. If necessary, click the Save As Type dropdown arrow, click Web Page, Complete (*.htm,*.html), and then click Save.
 9. The document and its folder are saved to your desktop.

Saving a Web Page's HTML File

- In the Address bar, type a Web address and press Enter to display a Web page.
 On the File menu, click Save As.
 The Save Web Page dailog box appears.
 If necessary, click the Save In drop-down arrow, and click Desktop.
 In the File Name text box, type HTML Only.
 Click the Save As Type drop-down arrow, click Web Page, HTML Only (*-htm,*-html), and then click Save.
- The document is saved on your desktop as an HTML file.

Saving a Web Page as a Text File

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 I. In the Address bar, type a Web address and
 press Enter to display a Web page.

 2. On the File menu, click Save As.

 3. The Save Web Page dialog box appears.

 4. If necessary, click the Save In drop-down arrow,
 and click Desktop.

 5. In the File Name text box, type Text File.

 6. Click the Save As Type drop-down arrow, click
 Text File (*.txt), and then click Save.

 7. The document is saved on your desktop as an
 HTML file.

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
